On October 22, during the NCGLNAC Fall Friendship Fire Celebration, Robin McBride Scott (Cherokee descent) will teach a class for ages 8 and up how to make paddle-stamped coiled pottery. Robin is well-known as an artist and for her research into pre-contact river cane basketry and mats. She has participated in the Smithsonian Carriers of Culture. Coiled pottery has been made by Native peoples of Indiana for several thousand years. It was used for the storage of seeds, food and cooking vessels. Students will learn basic coiled pottery techniques and the use of paddles for decorating the surface of a pot. The cost of this class is \$15 which includes all instruction and materials. Class size is limited to 12 participants.
